



Homework Guidelines

The purpose of homework at Norfolk House School is to reinforce and extend learning and encourage children to develop organisational skills. For the main part, it is relevant to what is done within the class and is also intended to develop the discipline of working and learning independently. Homework set will respond to individual needs as appropriate through differentiation.

Homework will be set through Google Classroom except for the 11+ study packs that require a combination of work in school and home.
